**PURPOSE:** To define the storage requirements of EMS equipment and medications stored on licensed EMS vehicles within the Central DuPage Hospital Emergency Medical Services System (CDHEMSS).

## **POLICY:**

All equipment and medications shall be stored in compliance with manufacture recommendations. EMS Agencies and providers shall have in place a plan to ensure that the required environments can be maintained to protect the integrity of equipment and medications and ensure functionality and potency. All medications shall be stored in a secured manner.

Agencies should be aware and plan for environmental conditions that affect equipment and medications including but not limited to:

- 1. Temperature (both above and below recommendations)
- 2. Light (some medications need to be protected from light)
- 3. Humidity level (some medications and equipment have maximum humidity operational levels)
- 4. Vibrations (some medications may become damaged with vibrations, equipment may need to be recalibrated)
- 5. Electronic Interference (confirm with manufacture recommendations)

Medications being used during trial periods shall meet the above listed criteria, as well as:

- 1. Isolated within its own sealable container with warning label on the container
- 2. Tagged for daily accountability and inventory control
- 3. Labeled with expiration date(s)
- 4. Be stored with Standing Medical Orders (SMO) for use
- 5. Removed when the trial completes

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
